Reading Comprehension and Vocabulary: For the remainder of the year our lessons will have a more thematic feel. This week we read: Miss Rumphius. This is a flashback story told by a young girl about her aunt who travels the world to fulfill her grandpa's promises only to end up right back home again. We studied the rich vocabulary in the story. We also focused on character traits and the motivations of the main character, Miss Rumphius.

Spelling: our final list of the year will come home next week.

Writing: I can take notes to learn how to be a good steward of the earth by reducing, reusing, and recycling.

Science: I can learn the importance of pollination.
